Montana Nonprofit Association (MNA) invites your proposal for our 2021 Annual Conference. This year's conference will be held online, through Zoom and other online platforms. The MNA Annual Conference is the largest nonprofit gathering in the region. In 2020, we welcomed nearly 2,000 nonprofit executives, staff, and board members to our first online conference. This year, we will once again host a virtual Whole Organization Experience that invites entire teams, from front-line staff to board members to learn, network, and explore innovative and creative solutions to serving their communities.

Conference Theme | Traction

After a challenging year, nonprofits are finding ways to move forward while rebuilding, re-imagining, and redefining their missions, communities, and selves. When faced with unimaginable obstacles, nonprofit leaders have found opportunities to reframe their assumptions, upgrade their operations, and partner in new and transformative ways. Much has been asked of nonprofits in the past twelve months, and the sector is again leading the way in creating a better Montana for all.
